Key Facts

1) Tudor clothing was lavish. Wealthy Tudor's clothes would be decorated with gold and jewels. 2) Ordinary Tudor houses were made from a framework of wooden beams with wattle and daub (sticks and twigs mixed with clay and dung) attached between the frame. 3) Phillip II of Spain sent the Spanish Armada to England in 1588 but was quickly defeated by the English Navy 4) Henry VIII became King at age 17. He married six times in the hope of having a son to be heir to his throne. 5) William Shakespeare was a famous poet of Tudor times. He wrote many famous plays that inspired change in society and they are still loved by millions today. 6) Elizabeth I reigned for 45 years but never married or had any children so when she died the age of the Tudors came to an end.
